What is Annual Fund?

The annual fund is a yearly appeal to our community — parents, alumni, alumni parents, faculty & extended community — to raise critical money that bridges the gap between tuition revenue & operating expenses.

The annual fund allows us to serve more families & collectively strengthens a dynamic education experience that meets each individual child. Supporting unique elements of Waldorf Education including & not limited to:

- Experiential Science: in class experiments across disciplines
- Practical Arts: handwork, woodworking & cooking
- Visual Arts: painting, drawing, sculpting & much more
- Music: strings, orchestra & flutes
- Multidisciplinary Learning: class plays, Eurythmy, movement, field trips, experiential lessons

Our goal is \$260,000 & 100% participation!

What makes up the operating budget?

Salaries & benefits comprise 85% of our operating budget. The remaining balance includes curricular & co-curricular programs, financial aid, equipment, supplies, utilities, insurance, maintenance & all additional expenses.

Why not raise tuition?

Making tuition increases as modest as possible helps us keep Waldorf Education as accessible as possible to as many students as possible. A school that charged the full costs of educating its students would be completely unreachable, hence nearly all independent schools use annual funds to bridge the gaps & most importantly, as a barometer of engagement.

Why does 100% participation matter?

The school's financial strength depends upon participation of the entire community. Parent participation levels are viewed as a key barometer of support & reviewed by foundations & outside funders when considering grants & gifts to the school. That we all give together, outshines how much is given.

Why does Annual Fund truly matter?

Without the annual fund, WSRF would be unable to provide a full, dynamic Waldorf Education in the Roaring Fork Valley nor would we be financially viable for many families in our community.

We wholeheartedly believe it is worth committing to nurturing human beings who will ask questions, build connections & create the future while moving with a guiding sense of self. Waldorf Education in its fullest form is capable of nurturing the whole human being; equipping our students with both the skills & capacities necessary to navigate our ever changing world.
